



# Faith in Community Stewardship of Life

All that we are, our talents, our prospects and our possessions are God's, held in trust for him, to be used under his direction. What a trust, what a responsibility. We may think ourselves unworthy as stewards of God's gifts, but he uses ordinary people to do extraordinary things.

He chose as his Apostles, twelve ordinary people. They were very different from each other. They had different trades, different characters and they were not members of the ecclesiastical hierarchy. In these twelve Jesus laid the foundation of the church. We too are all different, with different abilities, different skills, given to us by God, but we follow the same Lord and we should model our lives on his teaching.

We are given many opportunities, but we so often fail – partly because we try to do things in our own strength and not in God's strength. When we fail, God picks us up and gives us the opportunity to start again.

God uses ordinary people to do extraordinary things.

Most of us would say we are ordinary people.

The Parish of Plympton can do extraordinary things if we let God work his will in our lives.

#### Fourteenth Sunday after Pentecost

Both the writer of 1 Kings and the Psalmist focus today on God's house. How do you see your church? Is it a place where forgiveness is found? Is it a place where spending a day is better than spending a thousand elsewhere? Or is it a stained-glass fortress that exists to keep you safe from the wider community outside?

Give thanks for those churches that play an active part in their communities, and pray for those who have become a ghetto of irrelevance. May the latter find a way to take their place helping God to convert the world through love and care of the community.
