

### St Andrew, Apostle and Martyr

**30 November**

*Slange Var!* Blessings abound on this feast of St. Andrew, patron saint of Scotland and whose x-shaped cross upon which he was martyred (known as the Saltire) is featured prominently on the flag of Scotland. Elder brother of St Peter, Andrew spread the Good News across a broad sweep of countries, but most importantly, founded the See of Byzantium (Constantinople) that would later be the centre of Christianity. Younger brother, Peter, may have been chosen to continue and head Christ's church, but Andrew ensured that it took root in distant places.

Pray that we can emulate the courage of St Andrew in spreading the Good News, both near and far.
