

The Last Sunday after the Epiphany
Today's readings are full of signs and wonders. There is parting of waters, fire, whirlwind, tempest, and clouds. Such signs as these are markers of God's presence among us. God controls God's creation. God's mastery is for our benefit, however. This is made clear in the transfiguration. Jesus speaks with Elijah and Moses and Peter, James and John are terrified. Then a cloud comes, a voice speaks and Jesus is revealed, definitively, as God incarnate whose words are an imperative.
Lord, you who creates and cares for us, we ask that we may be able to see your signs and wonders in our lives, follow you and receive eternal life through Jesus Christ, our Lord.
Give thanks for the work and witness of the Church of the Province of Myanmar.

Ash Wednesday
Whatever you do, don't be a hypocrite. When you give alms or pray or fast do it in secret, don't broadcast it to promote yourself. Anyway, God does not require sacrifice; the only acceptable sacrifice is overcoming injustice wherever we find it. None are pure before God, we all need to repent and turn to God again. May ash be as a sign to us of our reliance on God to wash away our sins.
Pray for those to receive ashes today as a sign of their penitence before God and let their love for God shine brightly as they offer a broken and contrite heart
