



Revised Common Lectionary



1st Sunday in Lent

After the Flood God makes a covenant with Noah never to destroy all flesh again, the sign of which is God's bow in the sky, the rainbow. Baptism is a bit like the flood: dying and rising in water. At Jesus' own baptism, the Spirit descends and a voice from heaven pronounces Jesus' sonship. But then something unexpected happens. Instead of basking in the acclamation, Jesus is immediately driven into the wilderness, tempted by Satan. After the temptation he is ready to preach repentance.

Holy Jesus, because of your death and resurrection we too can be baptised in the Spirit. Grant us the wisdom and courage to proclaim: repent, and believe in the good news!

Matthias, Apostle & Martyr

Matthias was the replacement for Judas to keep the number of disciples at 12. Not much else is known about Matthias. I imagine that Jesus called Matthias 'friend' much like he calls all of us friends. Good friends are the family we choose. So much more Jesus' friendship. Jesus gives us the commandment to love one another because the Father has loved him. Keep Jesus' commandments to love and we will all live in love; that easy, that hard.

Loving Friend, help us to love one another as you love us, never forgetting that all things come from the Father through you, guide us now in the fulfilling of your commandment to love that all people may come to you.
