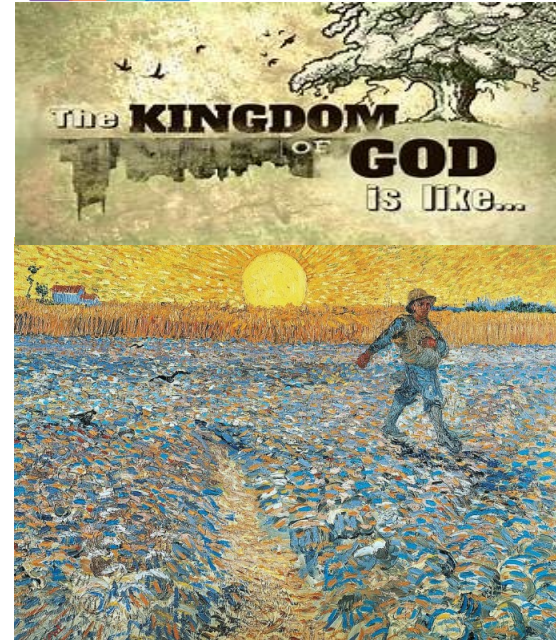

5th Sunday After Pentecost O God, you have prepared for those who love you such good things as pass our understanding; pour into our hearts such love toward you, that, loving you above all things, we may obtain your promises which exceed all that we can desire; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

6th Sunday After Pentecost O Lord, we beseech you mercifully to receive the prayers of your people who call upon you, and grant that they may both perceive and know what things they ought to do, and also may have grace and power faithfully to fulfil them; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen**

7th Sunday After Pentecost O God, you alone can order our unruly wills and affections: teach us to love what you command, and to desire what you promise, that, among the changes and chances of this world, our hearts may surely there be fixed where true joys are to be found; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

8th Sunday After Pentecost O God, the protector of all that trust in you, without whom nothing is strong, nothing is holy: increase and multiply upon us your mercy, that, with you as our ruler and guide, we may so pass through things temporal that we finally lose not the things eternal. Grant this, O heavenly Father, for the sake of Jesus Christ, our Lord. **Amen.**

9th Sunday After Pentecost Almighty God, whose beloved Son for our sake willingly endured the agony and shame of the cross: give us courage and patience to take up our cross daily and follow him; who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen.**

Prompts for Faith Sharing.

5th Sunday After Pentecost 'Radical Hospitality' Jesus calls us to this in today's gospel. When have you experienced this? How did it make you feel? How might you extend your offering of 'Radical Hospitality'?

6th Sunday After Pentecost How do you find Jesus' yoke? Easy? Light? What makes it this way? How do you honour God's invitation: 'To rest? To place your burdens at 'the foot of the cross'? How are you consoled by God's love?

7th Sunday After Pentecost Lack of understanding. Lack of connection/ rootedness. Worldly anxiety. All three can prevent us from 'bearing fruit' for Christ. Which of these challenge you? How might you set them aside to make more space for God's word to flourish?

8th Sunday After Pentecost God cares for us a farmer cares for a crop. How does God care for you? Does God's mercy and forgiveness speak into this space? Where is your life bearing fruit? How do you plan to share this gift with others?

9th Sunday After Pentecost What do you truly value in life? Consider: What you spend you money on? Your time? Your undivided attention? Do they all align with your values? Does your commitment to a Christian life require sacrifice? Why? Why not?
