Prayer of the Week

6th Sunday of Easter Eternal God, whose Son Jesus Christ is the way, the truth, and the life: grant that we may walk in his way, rejoice in his truth, and share his risen life; who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen.**

7th Sunday of Easter O God, the King of glory, you have exalted your only Son Jesus Christ with great triumph to your kingdom in heaven: we pray you, leave us not comfortless, but send your Holy Spirit to strengthen us, and exalt us to the same place where our Saviour Christ has gone before; who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. **Amen.**

Pentecost Almighty God, you sent your Holy Spirit to be the life and light of your Church: open our hearts to the riches of your grace, that we may bring forth the fruit of the Spirit in love, joy, and peace; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen.**

Trinity O blessed Trinity, in whom we know the Maker of all things, seen and unseen, the Saviour of all, both near and far: by your Spirit enable us so to worship your divine majesty, that with all the company of heaven we may magnify your glorious name, saying, Holy, holy, holy. Glory to you, O Lord most high. **Amen.**

Prompts for Faith Sharing.

6th Sunday of Easter Friendship & Love. Who is your best friend? What qualities makes this so? How have your understandings and beliefs about love changed over your life time? How do we know that God loves us? How is Christ present to you? How would you describe the impact of this? Believing in God & living a Godly life—how are the two alike & different?

7th Sunday of Easter In what ways do you not belong to the world? How are you beholden to worldly ways? What are the prices people pay for speaking out about the truth? How? Have you ever paid the price/suffered for speaking truth? Why is it that much of the secular world, businesses & institutions are wary/suspicious of biblical/gospel truth? When has God most been most present to you in times of struggle?

Pentecost The Holy Spirit, Gods Spirit is revealed to today in our reading in the forms of wind, fire & breathe. How else is the spirit present to you? What other images help us to know that God is working within and around us? How does the presence of God's Holy Spirit make our church different to other community organisations? Is there a sense that the spirit is calling you to do something new this Pentecost?

Trinity The Trinity celebrates the many ways that God makes God's presence known to us. Think about the times Gods loving presence has been felt by you. Love that creates, nurtures, preserves, makes new. What else does God's love do for human-kind? God's love becomes fully human. How? Is the Trinity simply theological understanding of the mind/ intellect or does the Trinity make God more accessible for you?
