



#### Prayer of the Week

19th Sunday after Pentecost O God, you declare your almighty power chiefly in showing mercy and pity: mercifully grant us such a measure of your grace that, running in the way of your commandments, we may obtain your gracious promises, and be made partakers of your heavenly treasure; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

**20th Sunday after Pentecost** Generous God, whose hand is open to fill all things living with plenteousness: make us ever thankful for your goodness, and grant that we, remembering the account that we must one day give, may be faithful stewards of your bounty; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen. 21st Sunday after Pentecost** Almighty God, in your wisdom you have so ordered our earthly life that we must walk by faith and not by sight: give us such trust in your fatherly care that in the face of all perplexities we may give proof of our faith by the courage of our lives; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.** 

<u>22nd Sunday after Pentecost</u> Loving Father, Almighty God, your Son has opened for us a new and living way into your presence: give us pure hearts and steadfast wills to worship you in spirit and in truth; through the same Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.** 

#### **Prompts for Faith Sharing.**

15th Sunday after Pentecost What do you think the 'sacrament of marriage' is? Covenant? Contract? What is the difference between these terms? What are the hardnesses of your heart? Is you mind and heart open to the wisdom of children?

16th Sunday after Pentecost What possessions, desires or ambition for wealth get in the way of Kingdom of Heaven aspirations here on earth? How might these barriers apply to you or someone dear to you? The False Gospel of Prosperity, Win, no matter what!, Conspicuously consume! Want what is of no lasting value! What is the cost to our humanity of these things?

<u>17th Sunday after Pentecost</u> Who is the most humble person you have met? What did their humility teach/inspire in you? Who are the 'servant leaders in your life? What was the impact of their service & commitment to loving service of others?

'It shall not be so among you' What are the most difficult teachings of Jesus for you? How does other people's arrogance & selfish ambition impact you? What does it take for you to have the courage to challenge this?

18th Sunday after Pentecost Can you recall a time or instance where you were emotionally or intellectually 'blind' to the truth of a situation? What did it take for you to realise this? When have looked back on a tough time and realised that God was indeed present, though you do remember feeling all alone? How might you better remember that God's love is always with us? Who are the faithful people in your life who despite all sorts of challenges and set backs, are an inspiration to you? Where does gratitude, remembering, hope, fit into your life and faith?
